Introducing Affiliate Membership

Eligibility to become an Affiliate Member of the OHT is open to organizations or groups that:

- 1. Deliver health or social services for our attributed population, or
- 2. Represent key sectors we know influence the social determinants of health

AND that are willing to contribute to the success of the partnership by committing time or resources (e.g. expertise, funds, people, space) to achieve the vision and goals of the Mississauga OHT.

At this time, Affiliate Membership is limited to organizations. Individual providers and other community members will be able to participate in MOHT engagement and codesign sessions so their perspectives and experiences are represented in the work of the MOHT.



What organizations can expect from Affiliate Membership

Our Commitments to Affiliate Members

- Opportunities to join engage on and support the continued development of OHT strategies and priorities
- Opportunities to join approaches to co-design and engagement sessions focused on clinical, services or digital implementation
- Opportunities to be involved in ongoing conversations about governance and representation of different sectors at our Collaboration Council

Affiliate Member obligations

- Committing to the shared vision and values of the Mississauga OHT when collaborating with the team
- Regularly declaring any conflicts of interest that may arise through work with the team
- We are not proposing membership dues; however, the partnership requires commitment and participation from partners so we are asking Affiliate Members to identify resources (e.g. expertise, funds, people, space) they would be willing to contribute in future



Defining conflict of interest

Conflict of interest can be real, potential, or perceived—each type can have a significant impact on the integrity and credibility of the decisions we make.

On a partnership projects, conflicts of interest can also be both personal and organizational.

Personal conflicts of interest:

Situations where financial, professional, or other personal considerations may compromise, or have the appearance of compromising, the judgment of an individual involved in decision-making.

Organizational conflicts of interest:

When certain groups have access to information or influence that could advantage them unfairly over others in decisions that impact financial or other interests.



Examples of conflict of interest

The OHT hosts a competitive procurement; an individual identified to sit on the selection committee has a financial relationship to one of the companies submitting a bid.

A technology vendor is invited to join a closed OHT meeting where the team shares information about their strategy, placing this company at a competitive advantage over others

One partner joins an engagement session that is not open to other similar organizations. This creates a perception of favouritism or influence that could affect credibility of a future decision-making process

Our Approach:

The Collaboration Council will be reviewing Expressions of Interest according to the following criteria:

Category	Description
Shared vision and values	 Does the organization to commit to working towards the shared vision of the OHT? Does it commit to aligning to our shared values when collaborating: Respect, Dignity, Empathy, Compassion, Accountability, Transparency, Equity & Engagement?
Service delivery	Does the organization deliver health or social services for our attributed population or represent key sectors we know influence the social determinants of health?
Conflict of interest	 Has the organization declared potential conflicts of interest and do these present any concerns in relation to our conflict of interest policy? Do they commit to regularly declaring conflicts as they arise?
Contributions	 Are they willing in future to contribute to the success of the partnership by committing time or resources (expertise, financial, people, space, etc.) to accomplish its shared vision and goals?

COVID@Home Implementation:

Collaboration between Primary Care, Home and Community Care Support Services, St. John's Ambulance, Heart House Hospice and Canadian Mental Health Association. Referrals accepted from Primary Care, Peel Public Health and the Hospital.



Contributed to COVID-19 Assessment and Testing:

- Cough and Flu Clinic operations: Collaboration between Care Point Health, Summerville FHT and Credit Valley FHT
- > Trillium Health Partners operated assessment centres
- Supported vaccine rollout:



- Primary Care Vaccine rollout: Working closely with Peel Public Health, Primary Care involved in providing Astra Zeneca, Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines in clinics and for homebound patients
- > Trillium Health Partners operated mass vaccination sites at University of Toronto Mississauga and Mississauga Hospital
